



- While in the public space, please adhere to the general rules of the keeping of dogs. Consider the interests of the people and respect them in your and your dog's surroundings treat those in the same way that you would want to be treated.
- Friendly greetings, when walking in the woods and meadows, signify likeability and goodwill.
- Always remove your dog's excrements. Scoop up the dirt and throw it into the designated Robidog bins. Never leave the bags on the side of the road or in the roadside ditches. Do not throw the bags into the woods or meadows.
- Do not allow your dog access to lawns for sunbathing or picnicking, children's playgrounds or wading pools.
- Always walk your dog on a leash in pedestrian areas, parks, green spaces and public gardens, wildlife parks, sports grounds, camp grounds, in the woods, conservation areas or nature sanctuaries. Please pay attention to the information boards, which prescribe mandatory use of dog leashes.
- Please be particularly considerate when meeting children, handicapped or elderly people.

 Demonstrate that you can control your dog and are willing to take other people's interests into account.
- Remember that wildlife and aquatic birds in the woods are easily disturbed by dogs. Therefore, put your dog on a leash in those areas. Aquatic birds are particularly interference-prone during the breeding cycle. That is why you have to put your dog on the short leash when passing reed belts.
- Remove wooden sticks and branches from cultivated land. Pieces of wood which are left cause damage to agricultural equipment and machines.



- 1. Never underestimate flowing waters!
- 2. Beware of water barrels below thresholds!
- 3. Use aids for rescues and don't forget to protect yourself!
- 4. At high water, put your dog on a leash!
- 5. Dogs are usually able to rescue themselves!

CHF 100.- Violation of the mandatory use of dog leashes
